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Storerooms



These storerooms were used by the Bixby family during the sheep ranching period to store furniture, tools, and food. Sheep shearing tools and artifacts are also displayed in one room. A narrow hallway between the two storerooms does not permit wheelchair access; contents are viewed through window displays.

Touch Tables



Two tables with items related to the cattle ranching and the sheep ranching periods are located along the south wing walkway. Visitors are invited to touch and interact with the items on display.

Blacksmith Shop



The forge and tools used by the blacksmith, as well as the workbench and tools for carpentry, are on display. A high threshold makes wheelchair access difficult.

The library was created as part of Library the 1930's remodel of the adobe. The current book collection is part of the Long Beach Public Library. Temporary exhibits focus on different aspects of history and feature items from the Rancho archives. Living Room Formerly a single-story parlor and bedroom, this high-ceilinged living room is part of the 1930's remodel of the house. It is currently awaiting 1930's furniture and exhibits. Child's Bedroom This upstairs bedroom shows the furniture and belongings of a young boy during the 1870's. The upstairs bedrooms are not accessible by wheelchair; a virtual tour showing room contents is available by iPad on the first floor. Master Bedroom The furniture in the master bedroom shows the multiple uses of the room by the Bixby family during the 1870's: sleeping, sewing, washing and shaving, correspondence.
